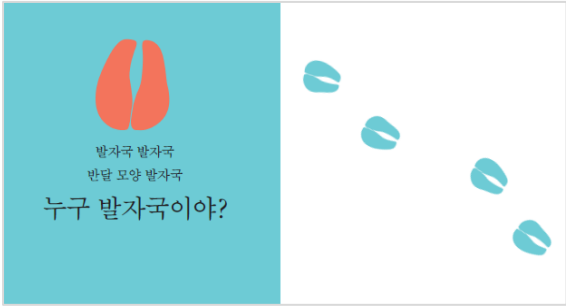

 It's me, a sheep. Those are my footprints.



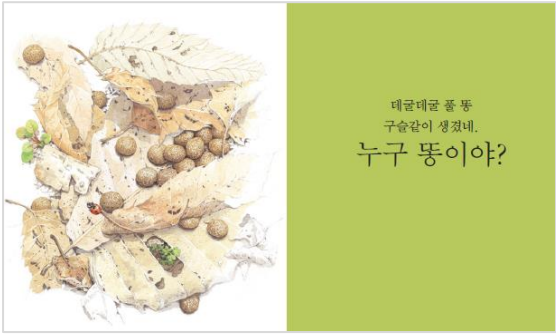
And there are flower-shaped with horns, butterfly-shaped, and arrow-shaped footprints, which you can guess.
