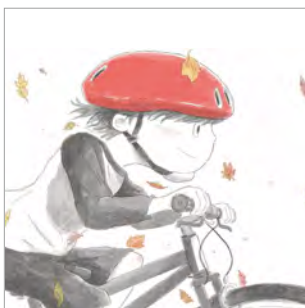
Cocoon Fairy Mayu

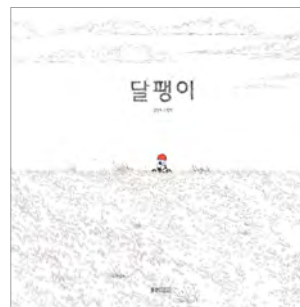


Little Rider

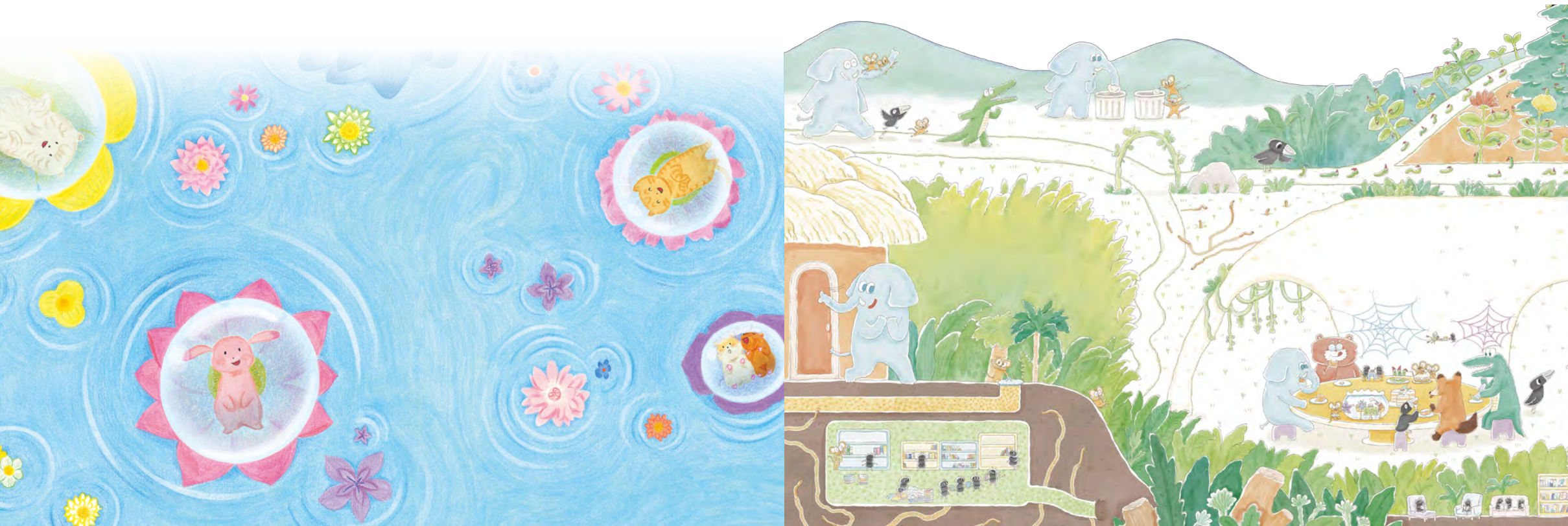


When You Break Rules

As they search for the bear's house, they face mishaps caused by breaking rules, such as jumping on the floor, slamming doors, littering, cutting in line, throwing books, and leaving the water running. The book teaches children about good habits by showing the consequences of breaking rules and is suitable for kids of all ages, from toddlers developing independence to older children learning to be more cautious.

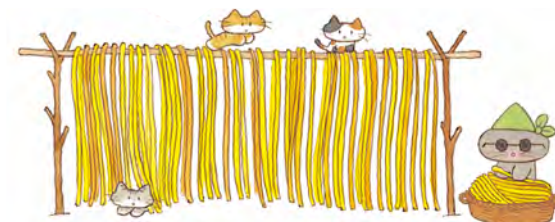

A Picnic Day

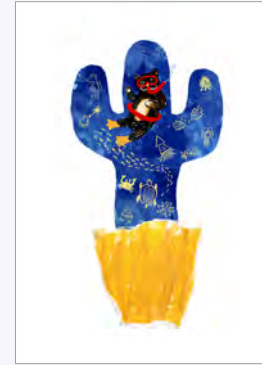

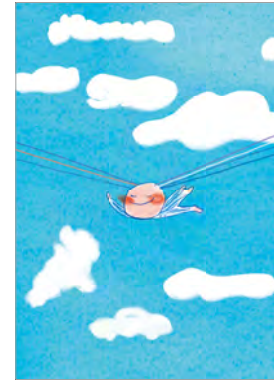


Never-before-seen Fruit
